

# Q & A about Confirmation

## 1. When is the Confirmation Mass?

Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020  
Group A- 10am  
Group B- 2pm

## 2. What time should I arrive?

Confirmandi and sponsors should be in their seats at least 15 minutes before Mass starts.

## 3. Do I need to come to a rehearsal?

Yes, it is very important to come to the rehearsal. During the rehearsal, you and your sponsor will learn all there is to know for the day of your Confirmation. It is also very important to attend your group rehearsal because you will occupy the seat you will be in for the Confirmation Mass.

Group A: Monday, March 9 at 7pm in the Church  
Group B: Thursday, March 12 at 7pm in the Church

## 4. Who should come to the rehearsal with me?

Your sponsor should attend with you. If your sponsor cannot attend, a parent can attend in his/her place.

## 5. How long is the Confirmation Mass?

The Mass is approximately 2 hours with reception following.

## 6. How is seating arranged for the Mass?

Seats are only reserved for Confirmandi and their sponsors in the front of the Church. All other seating is 'first-come first-served'. It would be best to invite up to 8 family members to ensure seating for everyone.

## 7. How should I dress?

Sunday-best! For girls, straps or sleeves are required. For guys, sport coat is not required, but in years past, most have worn them.

## 8. Can I take pictures during the Mass?

You are allowed to take pictures on only the side walls during the Mass. We hired a professional photographer who will have photos of the Confirmandi available at the reception.

## 9. Is there a reception following the Mass?

Yes, Bishop Joseph Perry will attend and be available to meet during the reception. There will be a designated spot for pictures with Bishop Perry. Beverages and appetizers will be served.
